"Richard Cecil's *Life of Newton* was originally published in just three sections: the main "Memoirs", followed by "Remarks made by Mr. Newton in Familiar Conversation" and by Cecil's own "General Observations". When the biography was first printed, many of its readers would have known or heard of Newton and his contemporaries. To make it easier to add some background information, I have divided the first section into nine chapters, roughly coinciding with specific periods of Newton's life. Where Cecil used footnotes they appear at the bottom of the appropriate page, but the references and chapter appendices are additional material

"William Wilberforce - the great nineteenth-century British statesman who fought the British slave trade against extremely difficult odds over a lifetime in the Parliament - understood this well [The deeper social currents that operate below the surface of politics are likely to have more of a lasting effect.].
